Data logger download and re-configure

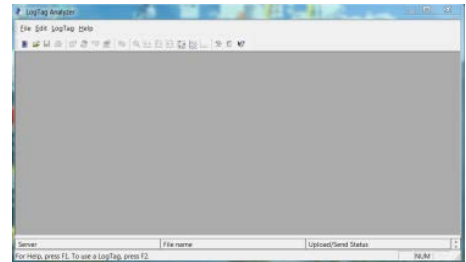
The data logger stores up to 30 days' of data. Therefore, you must download the data at least once every 30 days. Here's how:

Step 1. Plug Cradle into USB port , or ensure that it is plugged in.

Your computer's USB ports are small, rectangular openings. Sometimes they're on the front of the computer, but sometimes they're on the back.



Step 2. Open "LogTag Analyzer" software. You will see a gray screen. That's good!



Step 3. Insert data logger into cradle. The data should automatically download.

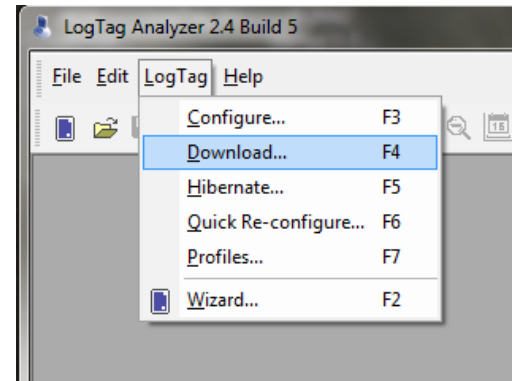
- If it does, proceed to Step 5
- If it doesn't, then try Step 4

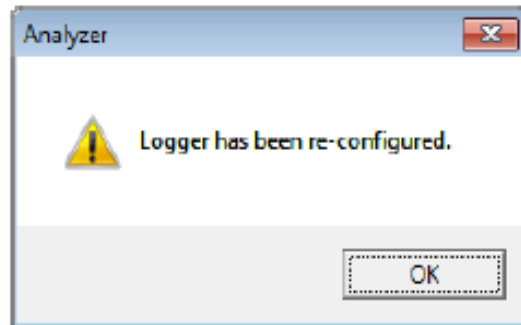

Step 4. If it did not download automatically, select “download” from the LogTag menu (see image at right).



Step 5. The computer automatically saves the data when the graph pops up. Where it saves the file depends on how your computer is configured.

Step 6. The data logger should automatically re-configure. You will see the pop-up at the right. Check to see if the data logger says “READY” on the screen. If it does, skip step 7. If it doesn’t, try step 7.

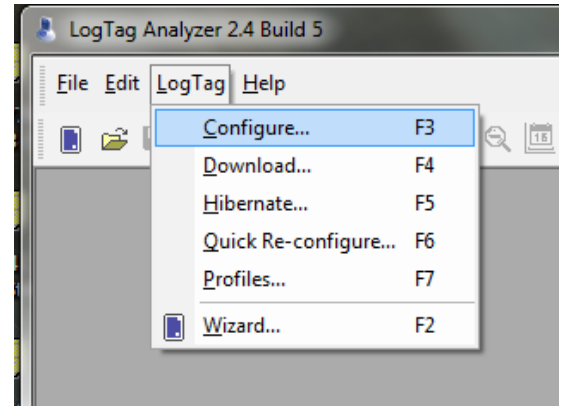

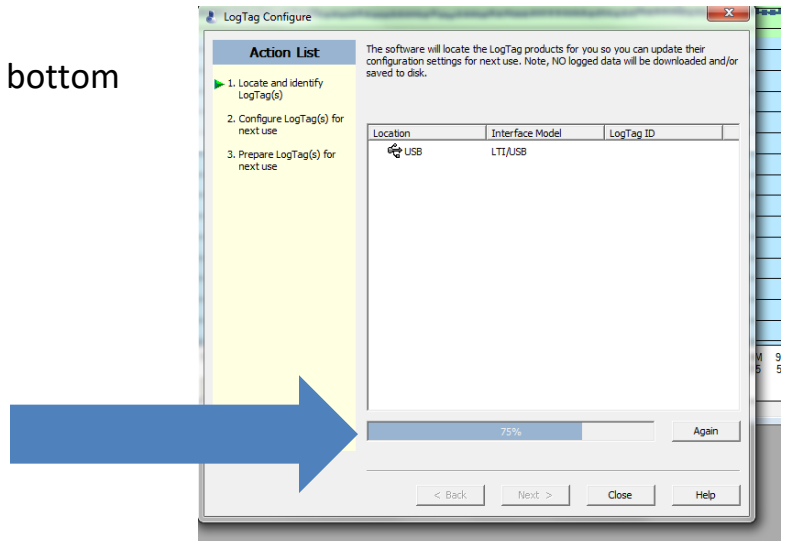

Step 7. If it does not automatically reconfigure:

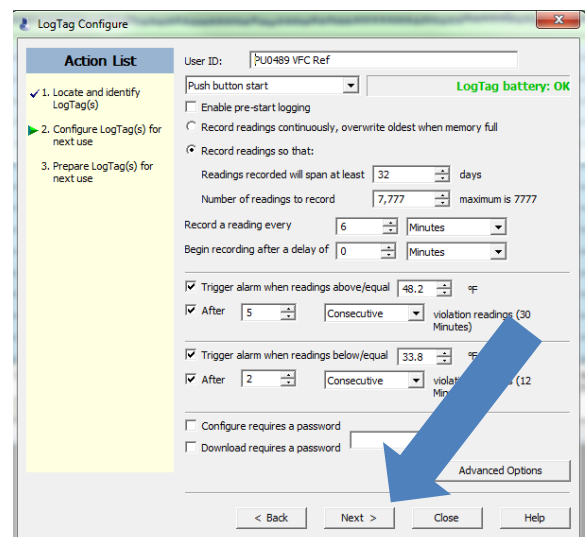
- a) Select “configure” from the LogTag menu (right).
 - i.



- b) You will see this pop-up. Wait for the bottom bar to fill to 100%.

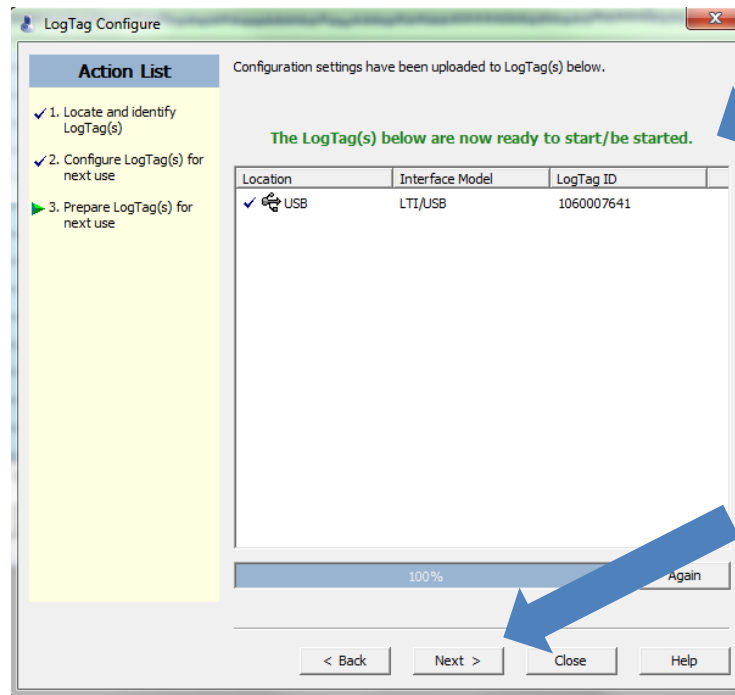


- c) This box will appear next. **Do not change anything.** Simply click “next.”

d) Wait for the bar to fill and for the green text saying “The LogTag(s) below are ready to start/be started.” The front of the data logger should now show “Ready.”



Success! Now, finish up:

- Remove the data logger from the cradle
- Email the data logs that you just downloaded to TempCheck@phila.gov
