Note: Medicaid providers are not required to keep separate records of VFC eligibility screening for their beneficiaries. Maintaining of Medicaid-specific documentation in a patient's chart, whether electronically or on paper, is considered adequate documentation of VFC eligibility.

<sup>\*</sup>To be supported with VFC purchased vaccine, underinsured children must be vaccinated through an FQHC. A record of all children 18 years of age or younger who receive immunizations must be kept in the health care provider's office. The record may be completed by the parent, guardian, individual of record or by the health care provider. VFC eligibility screening must take place with each immunization visit to ensure the child's eligibility status has not changed. While verification of responses is not required, it is necessary to retain this or a similar record for each child receiving vaccine.
